Professional Development & Curriculum Enhancements

Our team kicked off the year with two days of tailored professional development. Training included digital technology workshops, Indigenous cultures education, the 2025 road map and child protection. Additionally, we are integrating the latest Australian Curriculum Version 9 to ensure the children receive the most up-to-date and effective learning experience.

Key Curriculum Updates

Inquiry-based learning strategies for deeper stydent engagement.

Strength-based learning with targeted support and extension programs such as MacqLit, MiniLit, Bond Blocks and the first school in WA to plement White Rose Maths.

Ongoing small class sizes to enhance personalised learning experiences.

Our curriculum leaders are Tristan (Maths), Anne (Literacy), Kirsty & Clare (Wellbeing), Mandy (Inclusive Education).

Exciting Facility Upgrades

We are continuously enhancing our learning environments to ensure a safe and enriching experience for all students and staff. Over the summer holidays, we made several subtle upgrades:



- New ViewSonic interactive screens installed. in classrooms (Pre-Primary, Years 3-5) to enhance teaching and learning.
- New air conditioning unit in the Year 6 classroom.
- Playground and sand play areas refreshed for early learners.
- Windows replaced in the undercover area for better ventilation and lighting.

WHITE ROSE MATHS

We are very excited to announce that Quintilian School is the first school in Western Australia to implement the globally-recognised White Rose Maths program into our Year 1 to 6 syllabus.

White Rose Maths Australia is a new version of a highly successful UK-aligned maths resource. It offers a structured, mastery-based maths program aligned with the Australian Curriculum, and is a pioneering educational initiative that

emphasises a comprehensive understanding of mathematics aimed at enhancing maths and problemsolving skills.

At the core of White Rose Maths is the maths mastery approach, which focuses on depth rather than acceleration, ensuring key concepts are fully grasped before moving on. According to a study by University College London Institute of Education, this approach has been found to significantly improve students' understanding of mathematics, resulting in an extensive improvement in problem-solving skills.

The White Rose Maths initiative fosters a deep and sustainable comprehension of maths - it's not just about rote learning; it's about truly understanding and applying mathematical concepts. It is more than just a set of resources; it's a philosophy that places understanding at the heart of learning. It's about nurturing a love for mathematics and equipping students with the tools they need to succeed in a subject that is often seen as challenging. It's a fresh perspective that is reshaping how mathematics is taught and understood.

The 'small steps'

White Rose Maths divides each block of knowledge into a series of small and more manageable learning steps, and together, these small steps cover all the curriculum content that your child needs to know. Brain science shows that children retain more by learning maths in small, related chunks, ensuring children have a better understanding and greater clarity over what they're learning.

White Rose Maths launched in 2014 and is now taught in schools across 110 countries.
